Public Works

We have advertised in Chronicle, Quad City Harold, Weekends in Wenatchee World, and Chelan Mirror. Interviews will be scheduled for March 22, 23, and 27th.

Administrative

Asset Management

We have begun data collection to start implementation of the asset management program. I am working with Aktivov and Varela. Kerri has ordered the hardware for the program.

Data Archive

We continue to maximize the use of the new server system installed last year. We have now transferred 80-90% of City digital files to the shared system. The system has 3-backup cartridges, with one recording current activity, one is kept in the city vault, and one is taken to Sterling Bank. If there was a fire at City Hall and the server and the cartridge in the vault were destroyed, the maximum data lost is a week. All financial data is kept off site, on Vision servers, with backup and maintenance by Vision. The Public Works building now has access to the shared system. This is very useful, as forms and data inputs can be updated, edited, and accessed from both locations in real time. There are shared files and protected (private) files limited to specific users. See file access chart below.

- Tree City USA We will be receiving the Tree City USA Award for 2017 at the April Arbor Day Celebration.
- Arbor Day Trees for Arbor Day have been ordered. 100 Douglas fir and 100 white birch will be given away. We are still looking for local sponsors to help pay for the trees, any size donation accepted. The Tree Board will meet again on Thursday March 22 for the final planning of the event. Council Member Megan has been rounding up activities and vendors to make this a great event! The Conservation District has planned a FireWise community workshop to follow the Arbor Day event at the fire hall.
- Spring Break Craig, our temporary help man, will join us during Spring break, April 2-6 to help out. We will be focusing on Spring cleanup projects during that week.
- Douglas PUD Docks are to be finished and in place by end of April.
- **Douglas PUD** Memorial Park restroom is still on schedule to be remodeled this spring, but construction would take place in April and May. I have requested construction be completed by first of June for tourist and event season. If this deadline cannot be met, we would push remodel till Fall.

Water System Improvements

- Tapani is scheduled to start work on the reservoir April 9th.
- We have been working hard to clear up all the final issues regarding easements with Ok PUD, Whites, and Hagenbuch's. Although all the paperwork is not yet signed, it appears that we have suitable agreement between all parties.
- Application for Source Approval which allows us to draw water out of the new wells has been
 denied pending further reports and paperwork on our end. We are working on these issues. We
 will continue to work on preparing a temporary pump station at pump #4 (the downtown pump)
 in preparation for increased spring water demands.
- Attached is the latest site plan for Well #3, the Pearl Street Well, as a result of a site visit by Ben and Pete with Varela and myself. This is not a final plan, as we are still consulting pump experts about some site issues. We are hoping to get this out to bid by the second week of April.
